- Support projects that involve analysis of the environmental impacts of proposed energy projects, including analyses to support development of project-specific applications.
- Conduct biological and/or cultural field surveys, including field visits and associated internal and external reporting.
- Conduct compliance inspections and develop related documentation.
- Develop project-specific lists of protected federal and state species via available databases.
- Support administrative functions as needed, including document production and market research.
- Work with Project and Task Managers in a manner consistent with Merjent's reputation for excellence.
